Glossary of Terms:

JCR/SJR impact factor	The Journal Citation Reports (JCR), published by Thomson Reuters every year, provides quantitative tools for ranking, evaluating, categorizing, and comparing journals. The impact factor is one of these; it is a measure of the frequency with which the average article in a journal has been cited in a particular year or period. Unlike the JCR impact factor, the SJR impact factor in an openaccess journal metric that points to the frequency with which the average article in a journal has been cited in a particular year or period. It is computed using the same formula as JCR impact factor is.
Open-access charges	For offering free online access, many publishers require the payment of an open access fee (also called an article processing charge).
Hybrid open access	This term is used to refer to a subscription-based journal where articles can be made open access after the payment of an article-processing charge.
Automatic open-access after a period	Also known as delayed open access , these are traditional subscription- based journals that offer free online access upon the expiry of an embargo period following the initial publication date.
