
APA STYLE CHEAT SHEET

How to cite a journal article using APA style

To cite a journal article using APA style, you need to cover the following details of the source in the following sequence:

<section-header><section-header></section-header></section-header>	<section-header><section-header></section-header></section-header>	<section-header><section-header></section-header></section-header>	Publication year enclosed within parentheses (round brackets)	Article's title in sentence-case, i.e., capitalize only the first word & proper nouns



SOME POINTS TO REMEMBER!

- Invert the authors' names, i.e., an author's last name should appear first followed by his/her initials, each of which must be followed by a period (.)
- If the source has only 2 authors, separate them using an ampersand (&) instead of "and"
- The title of the article must be followed by a period
- The title of the journal or periodical must be italicized and followed by a comma (,)
- The issue number must be followed by a comma and there should be no space between it and the volume number
- Page numbers must be followed by a period
